It is safe for puppies, kittens as well as adult companions, and the change of eating patterns that is typically prescribed usually has far fewer side effects than synthetic medicines.

The benefits of Nutritional Therapy are sometimes immediate, and its effects can bring about long-lasting changes in our companions' lives. As there is usually not a single "best" diet for any animal companion, we tend to fall prey to common hear-say, nutritional fallacies and erroneous information transcribed from human diet philosophy. While the best gauge for a suitable diet is conveniently based on the appearance of our companions or if any allergie(s) is/are exhibited, that often deludes us from the fact that they may be lacking vital nutrients for a considerable time, leading to nutritional deficiencies.

Contextually, nutritional deficiencies are thought to be uncommon in dogs and cats, but it may well be developed secondary to other diseases or its treatment.

Thus Nutritional Therapy presents the following options for owners:
